Pupil Premium Grant

The pupil premium provides funding for children:

- Who have been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) at any point in the past 6 years (£1320 per child)
- Who have been previously looked after, subject of a special guardianship order and/ or adopted from care (£1900 per child)
- Pupil premium plus children currently being looked after or in care (£1900 per child per school year -held by the LA and accessed via PEP return)
- > Whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces (£300 per child)

Schools are held accountable for the spending of these monies, performance tables will capture the achievement of disadvantaged children covered by the Pupil Premium.

Pupil Premium Grant was used in 2018- 2019 to :

- Focus on continuing to 'Narrowing the Gap' support for Pupil Premium Grant Pupils, particularly in Early Years Foundation Stage where TAs are delivering targeted groups to develop communication and language skills.
- Provide afternoon Nurture provision targeting PPG pupils with Social and emotional needs.
- Increase the number of PPG pupils achieving **at the highest levels** in KS1 with targeted support for the most able PP learners to challenge them and develop 'mastery' of the curriculum, especially in Maths.
- Continued employment of a Pupil Well-being Co-ordinator to oversee the support of vulnerable children and their families with a focus on improving attendance of this group.
- Subsidise the cost of educational visits and extra-curricular activities for PP pupils to encourage full participation and access to the curriculum.
- Subsidise the cost of breakfast club for targeted pupils according to need.
- Provide additional opportunities through visits, visitors and artists to provide pupils with a range of rich experiences focusing on raising self-esteem and supporting creative learning.
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Impact of Pupil Premium (Summer 2019)

Reception

In 2018-19, 48% of the Reception cohort were entitled to pupil premium. Overall 60.3% of the cohort achieved a Good Level of Development (GLD). 50% of PPG pupils achieved a GLD (-10.3%). This is - 7% below n/a for PPG pupils.

<u>Year 1</u>

Phonics Screening Check

In 2018-19, 73% of the Y1 cohort were entitled to PPG. 69.4% of all pupils passed the phonic screening test. 66.7% of PPG pupils passed the test. (-2.7%)

Year 2

In the end of KS1 assessments the results of PPG pupils compared with 'all other pupils' are as follows :

In 2018-19, 66% of the Y2 cohort were eligible for PPG. Pupil Premium pupils achive broadly in line with National in Reading and Writing but slightly below in Maths.

The funding from Pupil Premium 2019 -2020 has been planned to be allocated in the following ways (As there are high percentages of PP learners in every class, a high proportion of the funding is used to extend the provision of teaching assistants across school – see below).

Continue to provide afternoon Nurture provision targeting PPG pupils with Social and emotional needs.	£11,750
Maintain the provision of two trained Emotional Literacy Support Assistants (ELSAs) to run targeted SEMH groups and one to one sessions on Friday afternoon.	£1200
Subsidise the cost of educational visits and extra-curricular activities for PP pupils to encourage full participation and access to the curriculum.	£2000
Subsidise the cost of breakfast club for targeted pupils according to need.	£200
Provide a range of visits, visitors and experiences to complement the curriculum and raise confidence and self- esteem, particularly for the Y2 cohort which has 73% PPG pupils.	£3000
